Dear Sisters and Brothers:

For the past several years, I have attended the March for Life at our Legislature in Fredericton. It is an annual opportunity to be what Saint John Paul II called "the People of Life" (Evangelium Vitae) and to defend life from conception to natural death, in whatever state or condition in which it is found. This year's theme, Women and Children First, offers us an opportunity to defend prenatal life and to show compassion for mothers who are with child. By our presence this year, we can raise a strong voice for life and mothers. We can encourage public officials to foster alternatives to abortion that can empower women to choose life.

This is my personal invitation for you to join me at St. Dunstan's Church on Thursday, May 15, 2014, at 10:00 a.m. for the celebration of Mass prior to the 2014 March for Life Rally which begins in front of the Legislature at 11:30 a.m.

At a time when our Provincial Government is considering its policy with respect to abortion and is seeking public input, I ask you to be ready to state your conviction and to express by your presence, your belief in the sacredness of life from conception to natural death.

Our Holy Father, Pope Francis, in continuity with his predecessors, Saint John Paul II and Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI, has reaffirmed that life is "a primary value and primordial right of every human being." Pope Francis reminds us that we are called to be witnesses and diffusers of the 'culture of life'. "This is a task of the new evangelization that often requires going against the tide and paying for it personally."

Please take advantage of this opportunity to stand up for life. By doing so, we increase the likelihood that countless little ones will enjoy the gift of life the way you and I do. As Saint John Paul II stated: "We must speak on behalf of those who cannot speak for themselves." (Evangelium Vitae)

SACRAMENT OF PENANCE / RECONCILIATION

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

To reserve our church for a wedding, couples must first make an appointment with our pastor to discuss their plans and complete the pre-nuptial investigation forms. At least a six month notice and taking a marriage preparation course is a requirement. Because of our pastor's schedule for two parishes, weddings cannot be celebrated any later than 1pm on Saturday.
