Also, these first Fridays will be a time for me to make pastoral visits to the homes of parishioners who are sick or shut-in. All of this having been said, I wish to reiterate how exited I am to come and to serve you all. I am certain that if we are open to change and willing to embrace opportunity that we will be able to serve our Lord Jesus Christ together with willing and eager hearts after the pattern of our Blessed Mother Mary. Please pray for me as I prepare to take on this important new responsibility, and please be assured of my prayers for you.
